



PURPOSE

- Promote the reduction of crime in Groesbeck business community along with nearby neighborhoods
- Increase availability of Police Department resources to southern Colerain Township businesses and residents
- Increase opportunities for proactive patrol to the southern portion of Colerain Township
- Maximize manpower effectiveness and efficiency
- Enhance communication and knowledge to businesses and residents

- **Redistribute allocation of Colerain Police Department Personnel**
 - Officers are currently stationed in one location for the facilitation of Police Department operations
 - The Colerain Police Department is located at 4200 Springdale Road
- **Redeployment Strategy for Neighborhood Resource Officers (NRO) and Bike Team Members**
 - Currently NRO's and Bike Team members operate from current location of Police Department
 - Bike Patrol Beats - Commercial
 - Survey Groesbeck Patrol Beats – Determine needs and use available resources in the Neighborhood and Commercial area
- **Establish Colerain Police Department “Community Resource Center”**



NEED FOR THE CENTER

- The area of Colerain Avenue, Jonrose Avenue and Harry Lee Lane, since the early 21st Century has seen an increase in prostitution, drug dealing, assaults and petty crime
- From an enforcement perspective, the Colerain Police Department created a "Plain Clothes" investigative team in 2007 to address issues such as drug dealing and other crimes. Since the inception of the team, a great deal of their efforts focused on this region of the Township and arrests have been made in response to the described crimes
- Proactive Police Department presence near the criminal activity center can help to mitigate the effect and presence of criminals.
- Efforts to revitalize the area depend, in part, on elimination of criminal elements and a sense of security for customers and residents.

BENEFITS TO COLERAIN POLICE

- "Community Resource Center" provides a place for reporting crimes, (when officers at the Center) thereby reducing calls for service demand
- Meeting place for neighborhood "block watch" and business owner meetings
- Visibility of Police Department presence to the neighborhood and the criminal element
- Possible monitoring of cameras for identifying real time criminal activity.

BENEFITS TO COLERAIN TOWNSHIP


- Increased police presence through the redeployment of officers to Resource Center
- Over time, an improved perception of this portion of the Township
- Lower “fear of crime” for residents and businesses
- In time, through proactive involvement and community participation, reduced rates of crime

- While a Colerain Police Department station will not, itself, cure the problem, it can become an important piece in the solution
- The Police Department Community Resource Center represents a commitment from the Township to the residents and business owners in Groesbeck that they are important to the Township’s success



COLERAIN POLICE DEPARTMENT COMMUNITY RESOURCE CENTER

The Colerain Police Department, Community Resource Center will be located at 7560 Colerain Avenue

- The space is approximately 1200 square foot of space
- The property is now owned by the Township and the property must be completely rehabilitated to include the replacement of the roof and remodeling of interior

COST TO THE TOWNSHIP/POLICE DEPARTMENT

- Property purchased through “Redevelopment Grant” at a cost of \$40,000 (Grant reimbursed Township for purchase of property)
- Colerain Police Department has budgeted \$45,000, to include signage, for rehabilitation of property to become Colerain Police Department “Community Resource Center”
- Police Department is responsible for all equipment to allow officers to work in the Center

COST TO THE POLICE DEPARTMENT

- Examples of equipment needed for Center
 - Desks, chairs, conference table and chairs, telephones, lateral file cabinets, computers, bulletin board, white board, stack chairs, coat rack and reception chairs
- The Police Department is responsible for maintenance and utility costs for the Center
- And the Police Department is responsible for the annual insurance costs associated with the Center

WHEN WILL THE CENTER OPEN?

- The goal of Colerain Township is to open the Colerain Police Department “Community Resource Center” by April of 2011
