EXECUTIVE SESSION

The meeting reconvened at 7:18 p.m. No resolution to executive session issues.

Pastor Skeet Stribling of Highview Christian Church provided an invocation.

Pack #826 of Bevis Elementary provided the color guard and led the pledge to the flag.

Mr. Reuter stated that he has reviewed and revised the minutes of 6/24/03 and 7/8/03. He circulated those for Board approval. He has not reviewed the others.

Mrs. Rielage motioned to approve the minutes of 6/24/03. Mr. Fiedeldey seconded the motion.

Mr. Fiedeldey questioned a comment, in the June 24th minutes, made by Mr. Corman to amend the previous minutes. Mr. Reuter responded.

Mr. Fiedeldey would like the 7/8/03 minutes to reflect that the June 24th approval was delayed because Mrs. Rielage was not in attendance at the 7/8/03 meeting.

All minutes up to September 23 were presented, but Mr. Corman needs to review them. Mrs. Rielage does not feel that Mr. Reuter needs to spend hours reviewing the CD's. The clerk is being blamed for the minutes not being on the website, and the reason is that the Board has not approved them. Mr. Corman agreed. Mrs. Rielage feels that it's great that he reviews the minutes.

Mr. Fiedeldey stated the 6/24/03 meeting minutes, submitted by Mr. Reuter, are dramatically different from the minutes prepared by the clerk. Mr. Fiedeldey feels it is imperative that the attorney correct them. Mr. Corman feels that review by Mr. Reuter would be sufficient, and any questions raised, could be used to

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verify information by listening to the CD. He would like to review and approve the minutes at the next meeting.

PRESENTATION

Edwa Yocum – Crosby Township – Presented F-check information regarding a cistern study, done in conjunction with a partnership with U.C. Environmental near the Fernald area.

The VHS tape was played, with audio only, because the VCR wasn't working.

SHERIFF'S REPORT

Sgt. Scudder presented the Sheriff's reports for August and September.

TRUSTEES' REPORT

Mr. Corman – contacted several residents to be on the dog committee. He introduced and thanked them for donating their time to the community. The first meeting is yet to be scheduled.

Mrs. Rielage – read thank you notes received from students at St. John the Baptist, to all firefighters; Bill Asbury, Public Works, took time to give a tour to a child who approached him while replacing a sign. The child showed great interest in the job.

Mr. Fiedeldej – based on the presentation regarding F-check, requested the Board's opinion on this subject. He explained his understanding of the problem, and what he feels will happen. He does not feel the plan is the right thing to do, personally.

Mr. Corman commented.

A public hearing is set for Oct. 24th, Mr. Fiedeldej thinks.

Mr. Corman recommended anyone with strong feelings toward this issue, attend the public hearing.

Announced that the Conservation program has exceeded 1280 acres. He commented on a situation in Green Township where they are considering the purchase of 34 acres for \$2.3 million. Probably 25 acres would be reserved for greenspace. Our residents have set aside 2 square miles for greenspace, and the cost is virtually nothing. He said the Board is trying to be frugal with taxpayer's money.

Mr. Corman – The Wall That Heals – Many people attended. It was a very moving experience. He received e-mail from a volunteer complimenting the Township, Greg Snyder and Mrs. Rielage. Mr. Corman thanked the men and women for their ultimate sacrifice.

He reported on Colerain Township Day at the Museum. It was a successful event. Approximately 100 people showed. The Museum is interested in repeating the event.

He was approached at Donaschwaben Oktoberfest to attend a reception for the German Ambassador this Friday and Saturday. He read Resolution # 52 –03.

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Mr. Fiedeldey motioned to approve Resolution #52 -03 Declaring October 16th as Herr Ischinger Day in Colerain Township, and October as German Heritage month. Mrs. Rielage seconded the motion.

CITIZEN'S ADDRESS

Robert Schneider, 6138 Mullen Rd. – (has property on Blue Meadow) This area is experiencing a drug problem. He suggested maybe a light be installed to deter activity. They have observed autos from Indiana.

Tom Kent, 2388 Cranbrook Dr. and Ron Mierhley, 2468 Cranbrook Dr. – would like to schedule a meeting with the trustees about the sewers to be installed on their street.

Mr. Corman suggested a meeting with a rep from MSD, a trustee, and our Public Works.

The residents said their problem is with the Township.

Mr. Fiedeldey volunteered to meet with the residents.

Tom Potopowitz, 7390 Harrison Ave., project manager with Wernke Steel – submitted a bid for the Pleasant Run fire station and Public Works facility. Questioned the process for awarding the bids.

Mr. Foglesong stated the recommendation will be to accept the bid from Wernke. Mr. Fiedeldey suggested Mr. Potopowitz set his watch 10 minutes fast so he can be prompt.

Pastor Donald Jones, 10049 Manistee Way – questioned why there was an increase in curfew violations. He wants to deter activity to avoid police records for the juveniles. He requested the schools inform the kids that there is a curfew.

Chief Sarver responded that there are either more kids violating the curfew, or officers were able to apprehend more kids in violation. He could offer no specific reason. He is very pleased with the number of violations.

Mrs. Rielage commented that there is an article in the Colerain High School newsletter about the curfew.

Jackie Rosenstengel, 7246 Creekview Dr. – follow up on the traffic light request the turn from Creekview to Harrison Ave. Mr. Chapman was instructed to contact HC engineer to request a traffic study.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Public Works, Dennis Chapman – provided info on bids received for the Public Works facility. He recommended the bids for the crane be rejected. He would like to purchase a forklift instead. Mr. Chapman requested approval to proceed with quotes.

Mrs. Rielage motioned to proceed with quotes for a forklift, and approve bids as presented with deletions.

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Mr. Fiedeldey cannot second. He doesn't want to approve \$25,000 for skylights. He has never heard of skylights in a maintenance garage. He would rather see \$25,000 go to the parks.

Mr. Corman stated that the \$25,000 would have to go toward the Public Works building because it is bond money to be used for this purpose.

Mr. Fiedeldey stated that this is above the amount of the bond.

Mrs. Rielage thinks natural light is a good thing.

Mr. Fiedeldey stated that employees will not be there during the day. Employees will be there to get the equipment, then go out on the job. There isn't much daylight in the winter.

Mr. Chapman stated that yes, they can do without, but then, electricity will be used to light the area.

Mr. Fiedeldey stated that having skylights in a garage is not very frugal spending for taxpayer dollars.

Mr. Chapman said the garage will be used more than just getting equipment and vacating the building.

Mr. Corman stated he has no problem with the skylights, and feels it is a safety issue.

Mr. Fiedeldey stated that the building is for the road crew, and he'd like to believe that the road crew is out on the road, and have a lot of natural light. Skylights in this type of building are susceptible to leaking.

Mr. Corman seconded the motion.

Mr. Fiedeldey would like to approve each item separately.

Mrs. Rielage reminded Mr. Corman that the motion has been seconded as presented.

Administration, David Foglesong – Presented the Re-bid miscellaneous metals and asphalt bid. Bids were reviewed by Turner Construction, and the following recommendations were made:

Mrs. Rielage motioned to accept the Re-bid for Fire Station and Public Works. Mr. Fiedeldey seconded the motion.

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Mr. Foglesong requested approval to accept the bid from Wernke Steel, for miscellaneous metals, not to exceed \$117,264. Turner Construction's legal counsel was consulted because Wernke's bid came in just after 10:00. However, the bids were opened at the same time. There was no competitive edge given to Wernke Steel.

Mrs. Rielage motioned to accept the Re-bid for Miscellaneous Metals. Mr. Fiedeldey seconded the motion.

Mr. Foglesong provided information on 2004 Community Development funding. Confirming with the Board, \$50,000 will be requested for the operation of Skyline Acres Community Center, and \$228,000 for various road repairs.

Mrs. Rielage motioned to make the request for Community Development funding. Mr. Fiedeldey seconded the motion.

Mr. Foglesong requested the Board proceed for the pre-emption system on Colerain Ave. from Galbraith to Ronald Reagan Cross County Hwy. He would like to proceed with test. He has learned from the State that they will not commit to the funding. The township will foot the bill if the system is functional. Mr. Foglesong would like to proceed with the testing.

Mr. Fiedeldey requested it be put on the back burner, until we know who will pay. How can we go forward with a test, when we don't know how much it will cost, or who will pay for it.

Mr. Foglesong would like to proceed with the test. There will be a charge or the equipment and installation if the test is effective.

Chief Smith stated the State agreed to pay, but is now changing their position. He feels the state is creating a problem, and we shouldn't allow them to walk away. A test is necessary. We can't afford not to proceed.

Mr. Fiedeldey stated that it be prudent to get a commitment from the state.

Mr. Foglesong will attempt to make additional calls to get ODOT to commit. He will have information at the next meeting. He rescinded the request to proceed.

Mr. Fiedeldey feels we should only proceed if the State will pay for the system.

Through negotiations, a tentative agreement has been reached with AFSCME for the contract with Parks and Services, and Public Works employees.

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NEW BUSINESS

Fire & EMS Department, Bruce Smith – provided information on mutual aid between Colerain Township and Crosby Township for Fernald. As of 11/1/03, Fernald fire and EMS services will be the sole responsibility of Crosby Township. Crosby has entered into a contract with Fleur-Fernald. Crosby Twp. will be compensated. Colerain will be included as a responder, for fire-rescue and hazardous material emergencies. One engine response is requested of Colerain Twp. Chief Smith recommended the Board approve the agreement. The agreement is with Crosby Township, not Fleur-Fernald. This is for the protection of our citizens as well as other communities. He provided information as to the materials still on site. It is in our best interest to commit to the agreement. The township is not obligated in any way, if there are emergencies in our own township. The agreement was reviewed and approved by Mr. Reuter.

Mr. Fiedeldey is not in favor of helping a private enterprise in a different Township. They eliminated their service to throw the burden on Crosby and Colerain Townships. He doesn't see how we can even consider this agreement. Crosby will receive \$525,000 for operational expenses for the first year. It's not fair to our taxpayers

Chief Smith stated that we have no obligation to Fernald. Our agreement would be with Crosby Township. When neighbors call for help, we want to assist. If we needed assistance, they would respond. Fernald still proposes a threat to this community. Under the mutual aid agreement of the State of Ohio and Hamilton County, we would be subject to request in any emergency anyway. We would still maintain the right to refuse to respond, if we felt it was not in our best interest at that time. Our compensation would be minimal, however, under normal mutual aid, they could request our response to the same type of calls, with no remuneration. Looking at the risk issue, that facility poses a risk to Colerain Township. In his opinion, if there is something significant that occurs there, our citizens are better served if the needed resources are there and do the best job to contain and control the situation.

Mr. Fiedeldey stated that by putting our firefighters in that environment, they are being exposed to chemicals that put them in harm's way. How does that satisfy the trust of the taxpayers who allow you to spend their tax dollars wisely?

Mr. Corman stated the idea is to investigate a problem before it gets out of hand. Our trucks should respond. He prefers this mutual agreement for our safety. Mutual aid will contain the problem to that facility, and keep it from our entering our township.

Mrs. Rielage pointed out that Chief Smith has said we will be dispatched for mutual aid whether we agree or not. You may not want to put our firefighters in harm's way, but that is not possible.

Mr. Fiedeldey stated that his problem is that if we are dual response, Crosby cannot get the contract without Colerain. We should get more money for responding. We should not spend our tax dollars to respond to another community. He is opposed to dual dispatch.

Chief Smith stated we have dual dispatch with Green and Springfield Townships. He feels this is in our best interest.

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Mrs. Rielage feels that Chief Smith has studied this and she respects his opinion.

Mrs. Rielage motioned to enter the contract.

Mr. Fiedeldey wants modification. The contract should not say FIRE DEPT. It should only say ONE ENGINE. He's reading the contract, and he has more experience than Chief Smith does.

Mrs. Rielage feels we should accept Chief Smith's recommendation. He is the Chief and knows what his department can handle. We are not obligated to Fernald in any way.

Mr. Fiedeldey requested Mr. Reuter's opinion.

Mr. Reuter commented that the contract should reflect the understanding of the parties. It should say one engine if that is the expectation of Crosby Twp.

Mr. Fiedeldey said we should respect Mr. Reuter's opinion on the matter, or you can do what you want.

Mr. Reuter feels it is prudent to review the agreement between Crosby Twp., and Fleur-Fernald. But, he doesn't feel it will affect our agreement with Crosby Twp.

Mrs. Rielage motioned to approve the contract with the amendment. Mr. Corman seconded the motion.

Mr. Fiedeldey stated we shouldn't sell our Township to somebody else.
