OPENING OF MEETING

Mr. Fiedeldey called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM with Mr. Corman, Mr. Fiedeldey, Mr. Ritter, and Mrs. Harlow in attendance.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Mr. Reuter requested the Board enter Executive Session for the purpose of discussing matters related to the employment and compensation of public employees

At 6:02 PM, Mr. Ritter made a motion to enter executive session and Mr. Corman offered the second. No discussion and the roll was called:

Mr. Fiedeldey reconvened the meeting at 7:03 PM. Mr. Retuer said no decisions or actions were made in executive session

INVOCATION

Rev. Andrew Norris of Christ Lutheran Church on Compton Road offered the invocation.

All recited the pledge of allegiance.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mr. Fiedeldey asked for approval of the minutes of the regular meeting of March 13, 2007.

Mr. Ritter made such motion and Mr. Corman offered the second. The roll was called:

Mr. Fiedeldey asked for changes or additions to the minutes of the regular meeting of March 27, 2007.

Mr. Corman requested under CITIZEN ADDRESS, the comments from Mrs. Heinkreiter and Chief Sarver read as follows:

Mrs. Heinkreiter said the location of the speed trailer is not going to catch speeders. Chief Sarver said that the purpose is not to catch people speeding, but to raise awareness of their speed. The goal is to get voluntary compliance. He said they will place it where the citizens feel is the best location, since they know where the area best. Mrs. Heinkreiter offered their front yard as a location for the speed trailer.

He asked that the paragraph under the discussion about the Blue Rock Road project read as follows:

Mr. Corman asked if the Engineer shelves this project and wishes to re-design the project, would the County Commissioners appropriate the money for the safety issues to be mitigated. Mr. Corman said he knows that it would cost more.

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Mr. Ritter asked that his comments under the discussion about the Blue Rock Road project read as follows:

Mr. Ritter asked if Livingston south of Blue Rock has a lower design speed. Mr. Hubbard said that Blue Rock is 35 MPH and Livingston is for 25 MPH. The higher design speed, the greater in the impact. Mr. Ritter said he and Mr. Hubbard discussed the project last week and they agreed public input should be sooner in the process.

And, as follows:

Mr. Ritter said he is persuaded that this stretch of road was ranked as the second most dangerous in Hamilton County. He supports the project as long as the residents' concerns are satisfied in the right-of-way process.

Mr. Fiedelvey asked that his comments read as follows:

Mr. Fiedelvey asked about Livingston Road, south of Blue Rock Road. How many accidents have there been there? There has been one in 25 years, according to Mrs. Bedacht.

PUBLIC HEARING

Stone Creek Lighting District

Mr. Foglesong said that the Colerain Township Board of Trustees was presented with a petition on March 29, 2007 for a lighting district located in the development of Stone Creek located off Colerain Avenue, within Colerain Township

The required 51% front footage signatures have been received with 100% in favor. The cost of lighting to each property owner is approximately \$1414.13 month. 26 new lights to be installed at this intersection as scheduled by Duke depending on workload

SHERIFF'S REPORT

Lt. Schoonover said the following statistics were generated in March 2007:

- 92 cases were assigned to the Sheriff's Criminal Investigation Section and 78 were closed, with \$61,275.00 in stolen property recovered.
- 15 D.U.I. arrests. By County contract and non contract Deputies.
- 182 citations were issued in March by Hamilton County Sheriff's Office Colerain Contract cars and 162 by County Deputies. Total 344

Lt. Meloy said the Township's department issued 311 citations with 9 arrests

TRUSTEE REPORTS

MR. RITTER

Mr. Ritter said that he has heard from residents from a variety of neighborhoods who have been cited for their boats. He said, many times, these are not large boats. He would like to make a motion to modify this section of the Zoning Code to allow the boats and RVs no longer than 25' to remain in driveways during the spring, summer and fall.

Mr. Corman offered a second to the motion.

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Mr. Fiedeldey asked about winter activities. Mr. Ritter said that not many winter vehicles come to mind. Mr. Fiedeldey suggested that we not get into the winter provisions.

Mr. Corman suggested that we should specify that the vehicle should not go past the sidewalk and hamper visibility.

Mr. Foglesong asked if it's a 25' boat or 25' with trailer. He asked for clarification for enforcement purposes. Mr. Ritter said that it would include the trailer.

Mr. Fiedeldey suggested that he would like to see it written up before the Board's approved it. Mr. Ritter read the final suggested verbiage.

Mr. Reuter said that we need to decide on the language as this will be sent to the Regional Planning Commission and the Zoning Commission.

Dr. Roschke said the Board will also need to consider a moratorium during the code-changing process as well as for those who have recently received a citation letter.

Mr. Fiedeldey said many communities do not allow this period and those communities are very successful.

Margaret Fields of 2838 Honesdale has been a resident since 1975. In April, she received a letter about the prohibition of boats. She has started a petition and has 200 signatures on the petition. The current zoning is unfair. She said cheapest storage is \$119/month and insurance rates will go up if it is stored off-site. They work hard and this is a recreation for her husband. She said that the dates are not valid because her husband has already had the boat out. She would like to see it all year round. Mr. Fiedeldey said that everyone will have a time to speak to this in front of the Zoning Commission as well as this Board.

Mr. Corman said that the beauty of our country is that it is made of laws.

Gary Delaney of 2838 Overdale Drive said he has a pop-up camper that is nine years old. They keep it in good shape and store it at the back of driveway, toward the house. He said the seasonal thing is hard because they camp year-round.

Michael O'Leary of 9275 Wardwood has had the boat in his driveway for 20 years and never had problem. It has created a hardship for neighbors who have had to move boats. The limit of 25' won't cover his boat; 38' is needed. His neighbors don't have a problem with his boat.

Donna Carey of 10000 Sturgen Lane said she has a 21' boat and keeps it there year round, covered with a mooring cover. She didn't receive a notice from the Township about this; did receive certified letter notice crumpled in the bottom of the mailbox. She asked about the fine. Mr. Corman said that in the courts, we have to have proper service. Mrs. Carey also does not want the seasonal limitations.

Jeff Wyatt of 2770 Royal Glenn also doesn't want limits on season. He asked about having it under a car port.

Lisa Schuler 2550 Berthbrook Drive said the boat is covered. It would be a hardship to place the boat in storage and would like to keep year-round.

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Pat Butcher of 2846 Overdale Drive said that she also received the letter. She has two vehicles; one in backyard, one in driveway. Mr. Fiedeldey said that one might need to go.

Gene Gebing of 9250 Wardwood. One of Mr. O'Leary's neighbors and the boat is nice. He owns a boat also. They all keep their boats nice

Mr. Fiedeldey said that he has boated all his life and they should be stored under cover. He said there is good weather in October and suggested they move the time frame to that. He said that he hears from the citizens that they want to keep them in their yards. He said that there might be a boat in poor condition that is an eyesore. He's not sure he can agree with on-site storage all year. But, he thinks there should be a season. However, we must do what's best for the Township at large. He said the intent is not to make someone's life miserable. He said we could consider having the vehicles covered and extending the period

Mr. Corman said that he empathizes with the people and their needs. We must hear the cost factors involved for this hobby. We need to make a plan and provide a moratorium. We need to look at this deeply. This is not a compromise of our zoning. Part of quality of life is being able to enjoy it.

Mr. Ritter said that he will re-draft the motion. Mr. Reuter suggested a resolution to be circulated for review and discussed for the May 8 meeting.

Mr. Ritter motioned an amnesty for previously issued citations for violations. Mr. Corman offered the second.

Mr. Ritter said he has taken an interest in the high number of mortgage foreclosures in the area. One of the issues is that the properties are not well maintained when this happens. Can we get on a watch list to be aware of these properties so they don't degrade? Mr. Reuter suggested we could watch the court index press and ID the properties by address. Mr. Ritter suggested that Mr. Reuter and Mr. Foglesong discuss this.

MR. CORMAN

Mr. Corman said he received an e-mail from the Ohio Historical Society about the sesquicentennial of American Civil War in four years. The OHS is looking ahead for a monumental occasion. They are asking for \$150,000 in the historical society budget for this celebration and are asking citizens to contact the General Assembly for this. Mr. Corman said we don't have an idea of where we're going if we don't know where we came from.

Mr. Corman said that we have received a commendation for our Fire Department from Good Samaritan Hospital's Emergency Department

Mr. Corman read a letter sent to our Parks Director, Greg Snyder, which thanked him for the extras done at the Parks for citizens for disabilities.

MR. FIEDELDEY

Comment on discussion about campers/boats. We'd all like to envision bright shiny vehicles. What do you do with the refuge from the junk yard that is barely still licensed? We must be consistent and enforce widely.

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As the trustee liaison to the Greenspace Committee, Mr. Fiedeldey said he passed on information about the MSD site to the committee. The Committee agrees that if it is not a clean site, MSD should maintain it.

Mr. Fiedeldey said that they have 1,500 acres in the conservationist program. He said they are making a concerted effort to target agricultural use areas to join the program.

CITIZEN ADDRESS

Shirley Mahaffey 9181 Norfolk Place said that across from her is a chicken coop and a vacant lot that is never maintained. She said that she has complained and never received response. Mr. Fiedeldey confirmed with Mrs. Mahaffey that they are debris on the site now. She will talk with Dr. Roschke about this.

Tom Walter of 4428 Blue Rock Road spoke on behalf of Mrs. Vi Daniels who was not able to attend tonight, but sent a letter to be read. They are seeking a change in the Ohio Revised Code to allow a stop light to be installed in the area. They have started a petition and asked the trustees to support them in the endeavor.

Mr. Ritter said he supports this 100% and would like to sign the petition. Mr. Corman said that this is the 10th year in a row that he has suggested a light at this intersection. We need to work together and make this happen. Mr. Corman suggested contacting the Ohio General Assembly about changing the warrant requirements.

Lisa Bedackt of 8296 Livingston said the petition has been signed by all the school district bus drivers and many others as they travel to work that way. She read the petition.

Gary Delaney of 2838 Overdale Drive said that he is allowed to place the camper in the back yard, but is having trouble with water drainage. Mr. Fiedeldey said it could be the County, the Township, or his responsibility. Mr. Fiedeldey suggested Mr. Foglesong works on this. Dr. Roschke said that Mr. Quinn has been out to visit the property and it is not Township property. Mr. McClain said they pulled the plot and learned that it is private property and the property owner is responsible. Mr. Reuter said that if it's a natural drainage swale, each property owner is responsible. He said that if it's debris, we must identify the other owners.

Mr. Corman discussed Project Impact and how Townships have no authority over waterways. He we can't force private owners to clean out. People need to understand that waterways are not garbage dumps.

Pat Butcher of 2846 Overdale Drive said debris is being dumped by neighbors. It's possible it's a county problem.

Gary Harrison of 9711 Marino Drive is having same problem. It's a county problem. County says there is a drain easement and said it's not their problem, it's his. Mr. Reuter will look into this.

Ms. Butcher said that there is a storm drain in the back of a neighbor's yard.

Aggregate Mining

Mr. Reuter followed-up on Mr. Fiedeldey's request from the last meeting. The Ohio General Assembly passed HB 443, which dealt with aggregate mining. If the zoning resolution treats surface mining as a permitted use, you can keep doing that. If conditional use, set out conditions that could be put in. In our, it's covered by the special ME district and is a permitted use. Our resolution already has set-backs, noise control, etc., which are conditions to this district. The difference between mining as permitted vs. conditional use, the conditional use is administrative, before the BZA. He advised to let what we have alone, with the knowledge that we change course in the future.

MSD Property Update


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


